# Place Highlight: Camelot


Camelot, located on the high meadow, is the meeting location for Senior Quest, our unit comprised of rising 5th and 6th graders. In keeping with the medieval themes emphasized in Seniors, it is named after the castle from Arthurian legend. In the center of Camelot sits the Camelot Cairn, made out of stones recycled from a well that dates back to when the campus was a farm. Questors begin each morning by hanging the shields of their respective castles (cabins) on the cairn's hooks. New this year, Camelot has received upgraded seating, with new benches replacing older logs. See below for a before and after.






# Super Seniors Shout Outs (Jennifer and Steven)
