
- POOL POST (Lynda)- At High Meadows, part of our instructional swim curriculum includes teaching

- For Unit Pride Day next Friday 7/28, Quest will be wearing red, and Legend will be wearing yellow.








- Quest has been enjoying castle challenges including everything from riddles to dress-up challenges. One of the features of Camelot is the Camelot Cairn, a special pile of stones located in the meeting place of Senior Quest. The castle shields are hung from the cairn in a way that signifies progress in the castle
- **Legend River Trip** is Wednesday 7/26. Legend campers will load up on a bus and drive through the Georgia countryside to the Edge of the World, a special place on the Amicalola River that we have been taking campers for decades for wading and shallow water play.
