- High Meadows History Highlight: CAMPUS ANIMALS. From the founding of camp in 1973, and even before, the High Meadows campus has long had animals residing on the land, as it was a farm for several decades before it became a school and camp. On the high meadow, there was once an animal barn where the Barn Theater currently stands, as well as a riding ring. We currently have five equines (Little Moon, Koda, Sir Bentley, Bella Luna, and Iron Man "Tony"), two goats (Kylo and Ren), two sheep (Lulu and Willow), three pigs (Hamilton, Boo,

and Storm), four rabbits (Onyx, Cinnamon, Sugar, and Murphy), and numerous chickens and other birds. Of all the animals we currently have, Little Moon the pony has been on campus the longest (since the early 2000s). Previous equines we've had include Silver Moon, Oro, Bingo, and Zufi. Previous goats we've had include Jody, Bunny, Curly, Capricorn, and Jumbuck. And previous sheep we've had include Maggie and Wooly B. Every animal we've had over the years has created memories for campers and students across generations. While some may be gone, their legacies live on through camp songs and stories.
