Place Highlight: Stonehenge

- Stonehenge is the hub of Senior Camp, hosting an array of pivotal activities. It is where Senior
 Legend convenes for morning and afternoon assemblies, and it serves as the grand stage for both
 the first day orientation and the last day awards ceremonies for all of Senior Camp (Quest and
 Legend). Nestled at its core lies the sacred knighthood circle. At the end of each session's awards
 ceremony, a camper who has ascended to the level of Knight—a rare achievement, with typically
 only one or two campers reaching this milestone each summer, and some summers witnessing none
 —steps into this circle and draws the legendary sword, Excalibur, from the stones.
- Below, you will find a visual journey through time: the knighting of the first-ever knight, Kat Pebworth, in 1982; Stonehenge as it appeared in the 1990s; and the Knight Board, where the names of all knights in the camp's history are permanently engraved. Additionally, we proudly present today's knighting of Willa, the second camper to achieve Knighthood this year and the 85th in camp history. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to Willa for her unyielding dedication and hard work, which have elevated her to this esteemed position.
